500 Years of Good News on the Move

"Ecclesia semper reformanda" ("The church is always reforming.") -Martin Luther

On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed 95 Theses (or ideas for debate) to the public notices on the church door in Wittenberg. It was the opening move in an explosion of Christian ideas that would come to be known as the Reformation.

For years I've had it in the back of my mind that I would live to see the 500th anniversary of this date. But now that date that always seemed far in the future is right around the corner. As we prepare for this historical moment (and MLC's celebration on October 28th), it's good to remember just how far we've come in those centuries.

Shortly after the start of the Reformation, wars were started over the divisions rocking the larger church. As many as a million Protestants and Catholics died in the first

century of Reformation.
Many pacifist Anabaptists
were persecuted and killed
by Protestants as well. Today
we share ministry and fellowship with St. Therese Catholic Church and Milwaukee
Mennonite (descendants of
the Anabaptists) as well as
ELCA agreements with many
other denominations.

When I was a kid, being Lutheran seemed to be largely defined as "not-Catholic" in doctrine and practice. But now Lutherans are more likely to celebrate our deep history of traditions and a theology of grace that makes us adaptable. We emphasize that "all are welcome" in our churches, recognizing that God's grace is a gift meant for all that frees us to put aside judgement.

Lutherans have always valued good education and the ELCA maintains 35 universities and seminaries in the US. Learning and growth for all ages remains a key part of Lutheran congregational life.

Martin Luther taught that good works aren't necessary to receive God's salvation, but are instead a natural reaction to being welcomed by God. Today, Lutherans are leaders in doing good for our neighbors. Organizations like Lutheran World Relief. Lutheran Disaster Response, Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services, and Lutheran Social Services are the gold standard in their areas for effective work and efficient use of funds.

From feudal Germany to modern North America, Lutheranism has come a long way. It continues to grow and adapt in amazing ways. For instance, there are now more Lutherans in Tanzania than in Sweden and the number of Protestants in Africa and Asia will likely surpass Europe and the Americas before this century ends.

But through it all, the bedrock of our faith has been that God gives us salvation as a gift of grace through faith. Because of that gift, we are freed to simply be loved and love others. It is a freedom that is still good news, even after 500 years. This is most certainly true.

Holy Curiosity

(For almost two years, I've been participating in a continuing education program called Leading Well that includes an annual conference in November and monthly coaching sessions with a cohort of other pastors. I share some of what I'm learning and practicing in this article.)

Over the summer, in one of my coaching sessions, we were discussing the qualities of a good leader. One of the qualities that quickly led to some deeper discussion was the quality of curiosity.

We started by talking about the need for curiosity for leaders. As pastors, to make our churches stronger and moving forward, we need to be asking things like, "How might things be different if we gave more attention to *this*?" or "What do I not know that would be useful to learn this month?" (One of the quotes I've tried to live by is "Leaders don't need the right answers; they need the right questions.") Curiosity is a key force to preventing stagnation and keeping the gears of a healthy organization greased.

As we spoke, though, we began talking about how curiosity is a great spiritual discipline for all people. We rarely mention it in lists of spiritual gifts or ask about it on time and talent sheets, but curiosity is an important practice for growing faith. If, as I've come to believe, the role of every person in a church is to "grow in your relationship to God and help others do the same," then curiosity is a great driver for that.

- What if we regularly asked, "What's something I've always wanted to know about God or the Bible?"
- What if we thought, "I wonder what I might

- learn by talking to that person I don't know well?"
- What if every time we said, "I don't know," we didn't feel ashamed or stupid, but instead asked, "I wonder where I could find out?"

I even raised the idea of making it part of a church's mission statement. How might it shape a church to say, "We worship God, serve others, and practice curiosity"?

Faith was never meant to be a static thing. Martin Luther said that "this life is not one of being, but becoming." And I think curiosity is an important part of becoming and growing in faith. Don't be surprised if it shows up in more ways in my leadership at MLC. And thank you for making MLC such a great place to be a curious leader.



At this year's CGFA, families were given several missions in order to learn more about God's Word and His promises. The theme verse was "With God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26b). We learned that anything that seems impossible for us is possible with God. The event was a mixture of time with intergenerational activities and break-out sessions by age. Youth and young adults led groups of children through Bible-centered activities and Pastor Ari led adults through Bible studies.

With God's help, she was able to do it. Teams hunted for Esther, King Xerxes, Haman, and Esther's uncle Mordecai using secret codes and puzzles. From each character, teams collected items for a service project. Together adults and children assembled personal care kits for Tosa Cares using the items they collected on their hunt. We made over a hundred kits for patrons at Tosa Cares. Thank you to all the families and individuals who donated items for the kits.

Our last night introduced teams to Moses and Aaron. We discussed how God can make things possible using the gifts of other people in our lives. For instance, Moses needed Aaron to speak to the masses of Israelites and the Egyptian pharaoh. Aaron introduced the final mission and teams of different ages had to work together to solve clues and assemble a puzzle. Afterwards, we celebrated the completed mission with s'mores. A special thanks to Moses (Scott Manske) and Aaron (Ben Koenigs).

Thank you to everyone who made this event possible: to the amazing, creative, and committed planning team, who generously gave of their time and talent; to the kitchen crew who fed families of all kinds so that adults could arrive straight from work; and to the adults, young adults, and youth who acted in skits and led and facilitated groups. 
